Sea Perch Competition





Scottsburg High School Sea Perch Team consisting of Alex Sexton, Jon Crawford, and Rachel Waymire, and team sponsors Rorie Lizenby and Brent Strong attended the regional competition held at Southridge High School in Huntingburg, IN, on March 9, 2013. Students constructed the Sea perch robots in less than 1 week from kits and tested at our local YMCA to practice for the competition. The teams were allowed to make modifications to robots for speed and picking up objects underwater, as long as the budget of each assembled robot remained under twenty dollars.

Teams were paired as follows with Scottsburg I consisting of Crawford and Waymire, and Scottsburg II consisting of Sexton. The teams competed in two main competitions where an obstacle course was set up consisting of 5 rings the submerged robots had to maneuver through in a timed competition. Finally, the last competition consisted of a deep water transfer, where the robots captured 12 suspended rings and placed them in a submerged basket.

Team I's first trial went initially rocky due to wiring issues with a new motor placed on their Seaperch robot and with no way to Test new motor, the team was left with quick thinking on the fly, but thanks to a quick fix were able to compete for a second trial through their first heat. Once completed, Team 1 was ready to roll again!!! Once back in the water for the second trial through their initial competition, the team noticed the robot would not submerge. So, once again with a chance of not completing this first heat, Team I thought outside the box to decrease buoyancy and removed just the right amount of floats attached to robots. Therefore under pressure and still under the 5 minute clock time penalty was able to complete the heat, and pulled through with a super time of 4:22!

For Scottsburg team II, Sexton was able to complete the initial trial heat with relatively no problems until hitting the last loop in the hurdle when he snagged a tether line on a loop, but with Crawford's help was able to set free in a record time of 2:19!

The final heat consisted of picking up 12 rings 6 on 6 and placing them in 2 baskets. The baskets were layered 1 on top of the other and students released them in the basket.

Scottsburg team I, were able to do very well based on the design of their robot while Team 2 made a very valiant effort but had to overcome a design obstacle.

Our teams placed very respectively in a first time competition as students were commended by all judges on their ability to think critically on the fly under pressure and their sportsmanship and teamwork abilities. Scottsburg I placed 8th/ 12th in the 1st trial obstacle course beating out all Prosser teams and Forrest Park High School. Scottsburg II placed 6th / 12 beating out Scottsburg Team 1, all Forrest Park teams, and all Prosser Technology teams. Finally, the last heat of competition, the deep water transfer, Scottsburg Team I placed 5th/ 12 beating out Springs Valley High School, all Prosser Teams, Southridge High School, and Forrest Park High School. Finally Scottsburg II placed 9th/12 teams beating out Prosser, Southridge, and Forrest Park High School. At the end of the competition both Scottsburg teams were commended on their outstanding performance on their first time competition at this regional defeating many of the teams at the schools who had daily use of practice facilities for testing earlier in the previous months!!! Our students represented yet another great effort by demonstrating Warrior pride in and out of the classroom!!!
