Supreme Court Case

Journalism students just completed their Mock Trial project of Supreme Court Case Morse v. Frederick. Portraying roles as lawyers, justices, and reporters,

students researched First Amendment cases dealing with student free speech, assembly, and press rights as they prepared their cases.

Helping in the project, Scott County Prosecutor Jason Mount visited all four journalism classes to offer his expertise in how to break down support for a case by using one of the cases they were studying. The following week, students had their cases prepared and conducted the trial under the direction of their Chief justices. The real Supreme Court Case ended in a 5-4 vote in favor of the petitioner, Principal Deborah Morse. The school cases also ended closely with the courts in two classes finding in favor of Morse and two courts finding in favor of the student Joseph Frederick.
