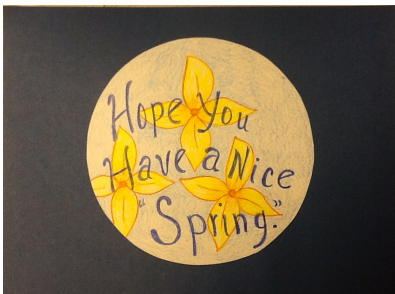

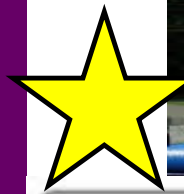

## Scottsburg High School Prom Guidelines

The Scottsburg High School Junior-Senior Prom is an extracurricular event sponsored by Scott County School District 2 and the Junior Class of SHS for the SHS Junior and Senior Class students and their approved guests.

- A ticket must be purchased in advance of the Prom to attend. SHS Seniors may attend as guests of the Junior Class, but must still obtain a ticket. Juniors may purchase a ticket or obtain a ticket through approved school fund raising efforts.
- To attend the SHS Prom, a student must be in good standing and not be suspended or expelled from SHS or the school they were attending at the time of the Prom. SHS Seniors who have graduated at mid-year are welcome to attend. SHS Virtual School students are not eligible to attend, as SHS student or as guests.
- SHS students may attend the Prom without a guest. SHS students bringing a guest must identify their date at the time they purchase or obtain their ticket and receive approval from the administration. Guests must provide an approved photo ID (school I.D., driver's license, etc.) at the time tickets are obtained.
- Guests attending the Prom with an SHS student must:
  - be identified at the time of ticket purchase with proper picture ID;
  - be at least 15 years of age and under 21 years of age;
  - not be enrolled in middle or elementary public, charter, or private school;
  - not be suspended or expelled from any public, charter, or private school at the time of the Prom;
  - and agree to comply with the SHS Student Conduct Rules.

No one will be admitted to the Prom without a ticket purchased by the announced deadline. The High School Principal or designee may waive this requirement if the student was unable to purchase a ticket prior to this deadline.

Students and guests must sign in when arriving at the Prom and sign out when leaving the Prom. Students and guests will not be re-admitted to the Prom after signing out.

A student, date, or adult attending the SHS Prom shall not consume alcoholic beverages or controlled substances during the Prom or on the way to or from the Prom. Participants may be required to submit to an alcohol detection mouth swab. If the participant refuses to cooperate with the swab, or if the analysis of the swab shows a violation of this requirement, the violator will be held for release to law enforcement officers. Parents/guardians will be called after law enforcement officers have been called.

Students or guests may be removed from the Prom by the School Principal or designee for violation of SHS Student Conduct Rules. Additional disciplinary measures may be imposed for violation of SHS Student Conduct Rules at the Prom.
