In the last eight months we have learned several skills in the medical field, some of them including CPR, intubation, and back boarding. Apart from that, we know how to handle various situations such as Trauma, Respiratory, Cardiac Arrest, Altered Mental Status, and Allergic Reactions.

Being an EMT, you find yourself in several different situations. The things we experience in our class are unlimited. Several of us have worked Cardiac Arrest patients, and some have also experienced suicidal situations, along with drug overdose. The real world doesn't hold back when you are an EMT.

This class has set us up for real life. We live under the stress of the medical world, and for all of us, we wouldn't be able to handle this if it wasn't for Mrs. Davis. She knows how to push us and she knows how to drill information into our heads. She went from being that regular goofy teacher, to being our EMT instructor. Everyone knows her as that crazy Spanish lady, but in our class, where real lives are at stake, she is a totally different kind of teacher. She yells, she lectures, and she even throws things at us when we reenact scenarios and she plays a distraught mother. But when it comes down to it, she is only trying to teach us how to handle those crazy unexpected moments.

Since this class started, we have been in more grown up situations than ever before. Being a part of EMT has taught us how to take on the world of the medical field, and it has taught us not to be afraid to help.

We have a little less than 3 months left; let's see what else the world has to throw at us.

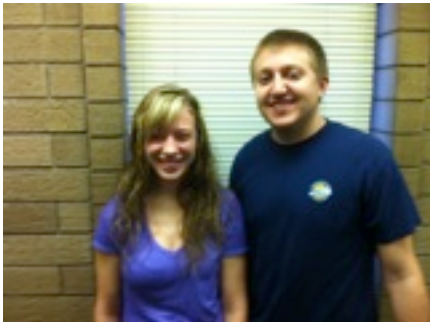
