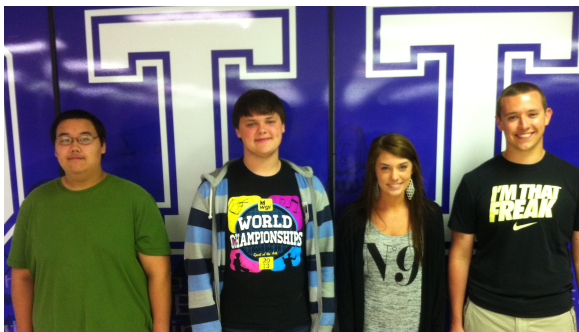

## SHS Filmmakers Win Big!

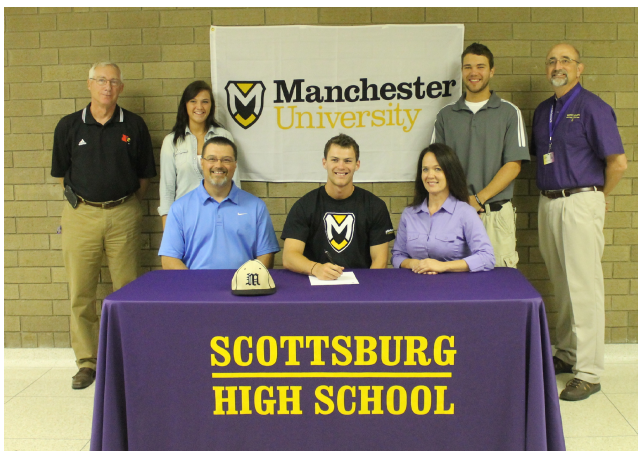
