Terry Hall Convocation

Convocation with Guest Speaker on Tuesday September 25th

Scott County School District 2 schools will be having a guest speaker, retired Indianapolis police officer Terry Hall, presenting the "Body Safety Program" next week.

Terry is a 30 year veteran of the Indianapolis Police Department

and developed this program in the early 1980s when he realized prevention was the key to stopping child abuse. Our local Prevent Child Abuse Council and Department of Children's Services have coordinated this presentation for all of Scott County's elementary, middle, and high schools.

Each program is age appropriate, as information given to kindergarten and first grade will be different from information given to middle school students. High school students will be given information to keep themselves safe in dating relationships as well. There will be an information session for the community on Monday, September 24th at First Southern Baptist Church at 6:00pm. Terry will go over the material he will be presenting to students and address questions and concerns.

Any parent who does not wish for their child to hear Terry's presentation must notify the building principal before the presentation. Terry also asks that the children not be told that a police officer or someone from the police department will be speaking. It is important that the children focus on his message, not his job.

He will present to Scottsburg High School students on Tuesday, September 25th.

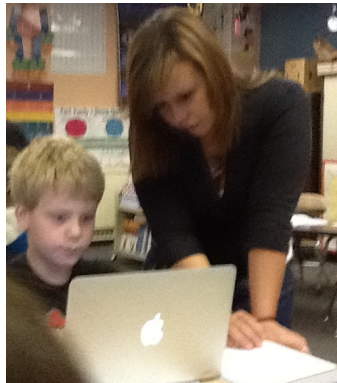
